Since the Chinook breed hails from New Hampshire, it was fitting to hold our first club Specialty in the state where the Chinook breed originated. Our Show Trail and Trail Chair, Candace Mizell, with her two sisters Mike Mankins and Cherie Holmquist (all from Texas), even made the 100 mile trek from Merrimack to Wanalancet and the Chinook Trail to visit the historic birthplace of the Chinook!

The day of the Specialty was sunny and warm - a beautiful fall day and perfect weather for a Specialty. The day began at 8 am at the show site where we gathered to set up our CCA booth and organize the ribbons for the match. Our Chinook history table was overflowing with historic Chinook photographs and news articles from the Perry Greene Era. This booth was attended by Peter Richards who is Perry Greene's grandson, Peter's wife Brenda and Peter's son Perry Richards. Perry Greene's beautiful, hand-painted 4ft X 15ft mural of a team of Chinooks in deep snow was used as a back-drop to the history table. We also had a table with an assortment of super raffle items which were all donated by our members, another table with custom screenprinted Chinook T-shirts and Chinook note cards, a table with Candace's canine artwork on display, and a table with AKC Canine Health Foundation information and handouts. Giveaways included specialty magnets featuring Perry Greene Riki on them and CCA Four-Chinooks Art on refrigerator magnets,
