



Ten Important Breed Features to remember about the Chinook

1. An all purpose sled dog who must be able to perform the work for which it was bred.
2. A brown eyed, tawny, muscular dog with a medium length, close fitting, double coat.
3. Darker to black markings on the ears, muzzle, and around the eyes are preferred.
4. A dog sound of body as well as temperament.
5. A dog slightly longer than tall.
6. A moderately angulated dog, in balance front to rear, and overall with movement that is smooth, easy, and tireless.
7. A saber tail held in a graceful sickle curve when alert or moving.
8. Any ear type is allowed, including drop, prick, propeller ears, or even mismatched but for aesthetic purposes dropped and matching ears are preferred.
9. A dog with a friendly temperament.
10. A natural breed, trimming of coat is not allowed.
