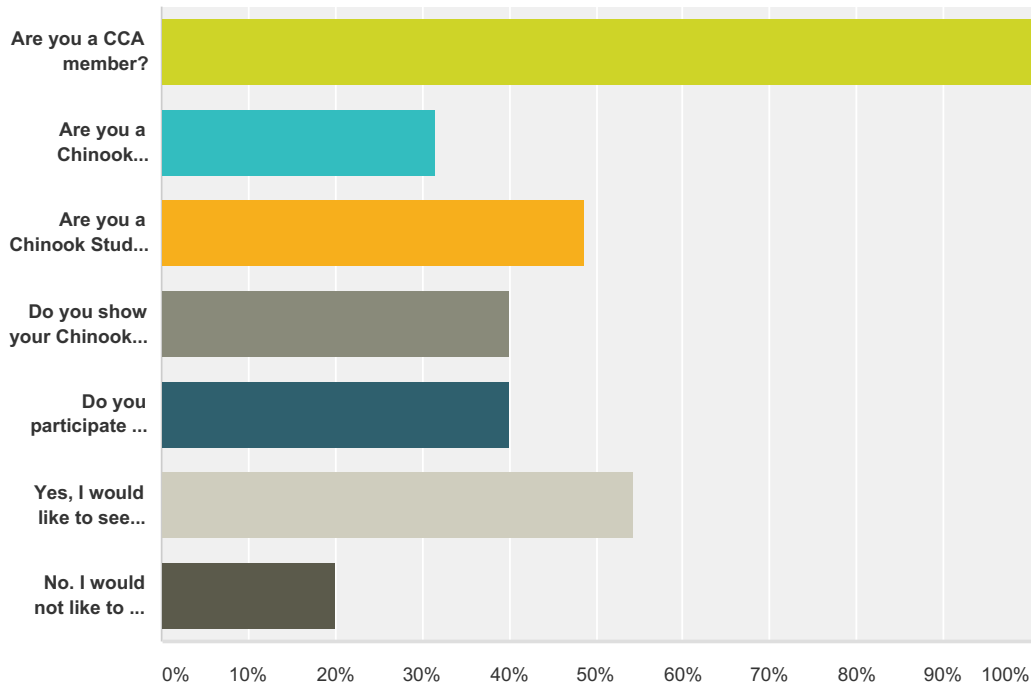

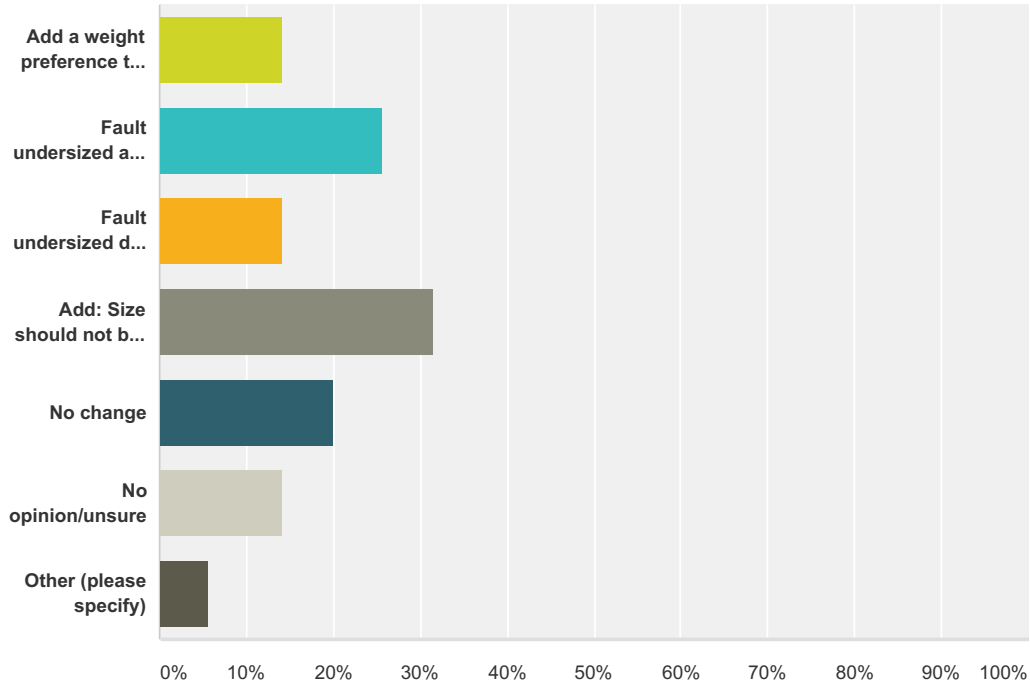

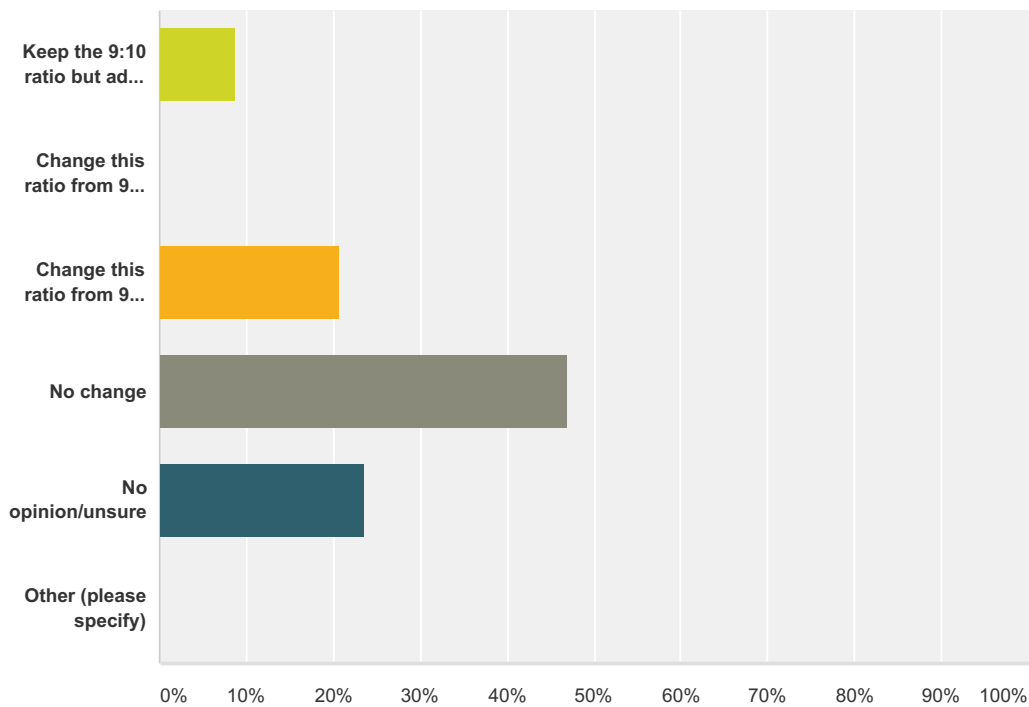

The proportion of height to length of body being as 9:10 in ratio."Breed Standard Examples: Slightly longer than tall (or slightly greater length): Chinook, Newfoundland, Great Pyrenees, Greater Swiss Mountain Dog, Komondor, Irish Setter, Golden Retriever, Pharaoh Hound, Norwegian Lundehund, American Eskimo. 9:10 ratios: Chinook, Leonberger, Rottweiler, Greater Swiss. 8.5:10 ratio: "Longer than tall": German Shepherd Dog. 8:10 ratio: Entlebucher, Bearded Collie.

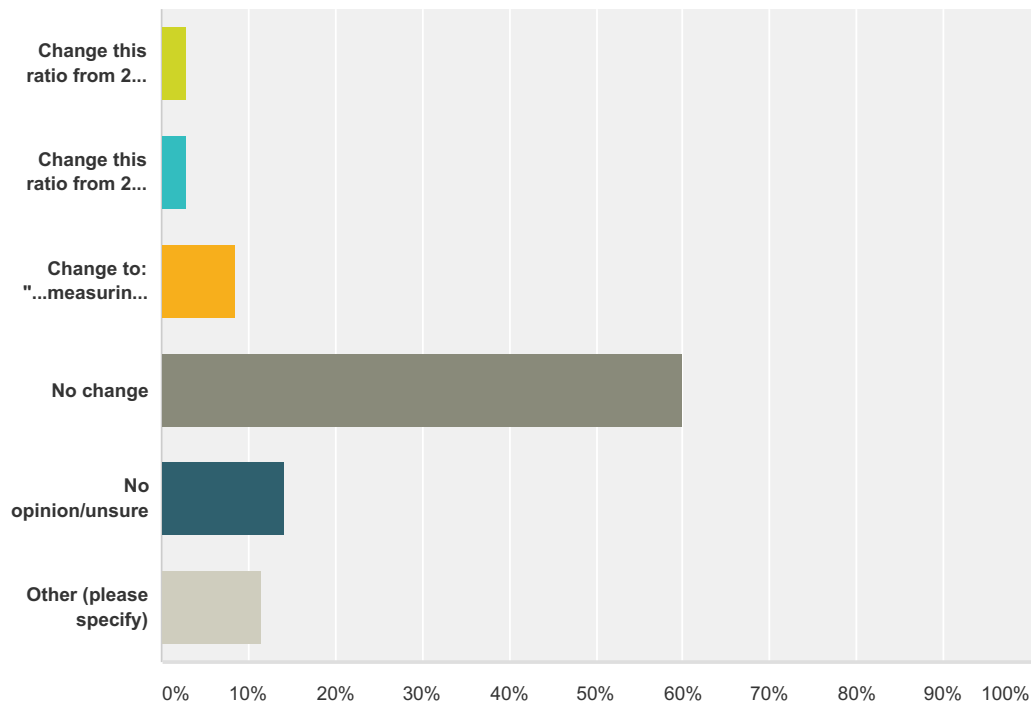

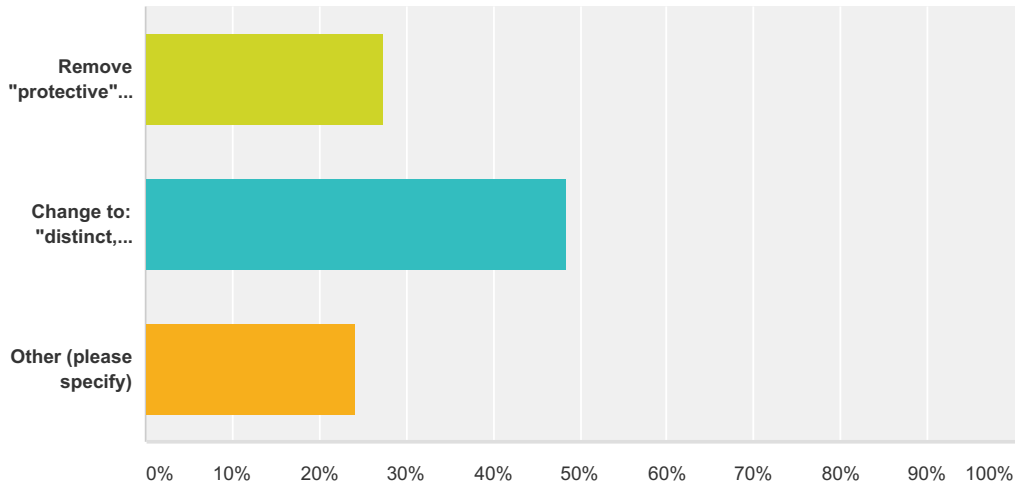

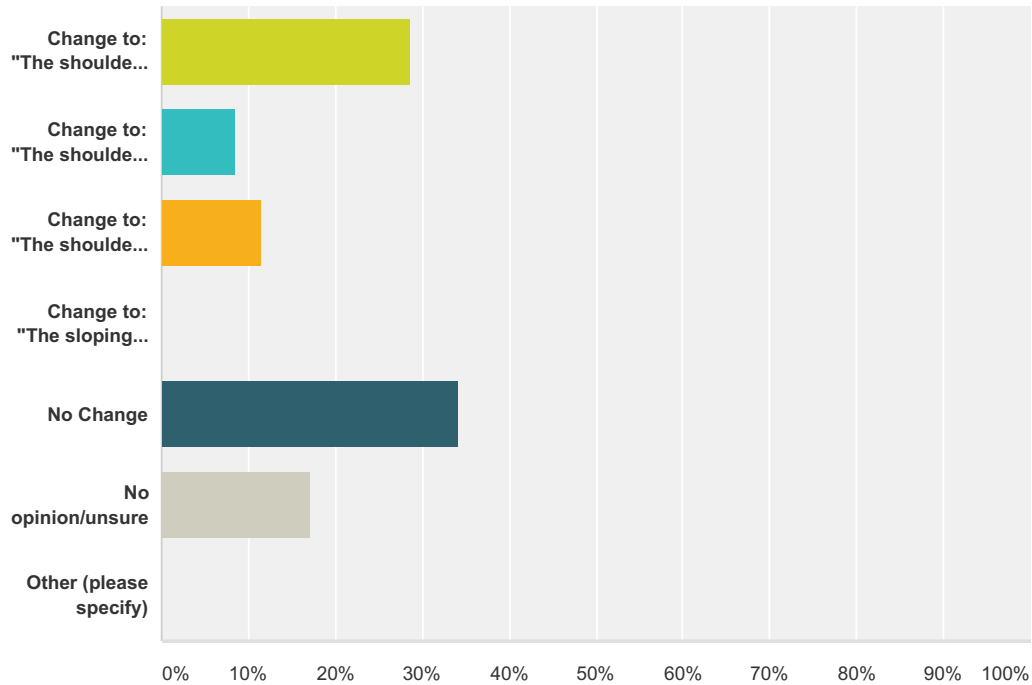

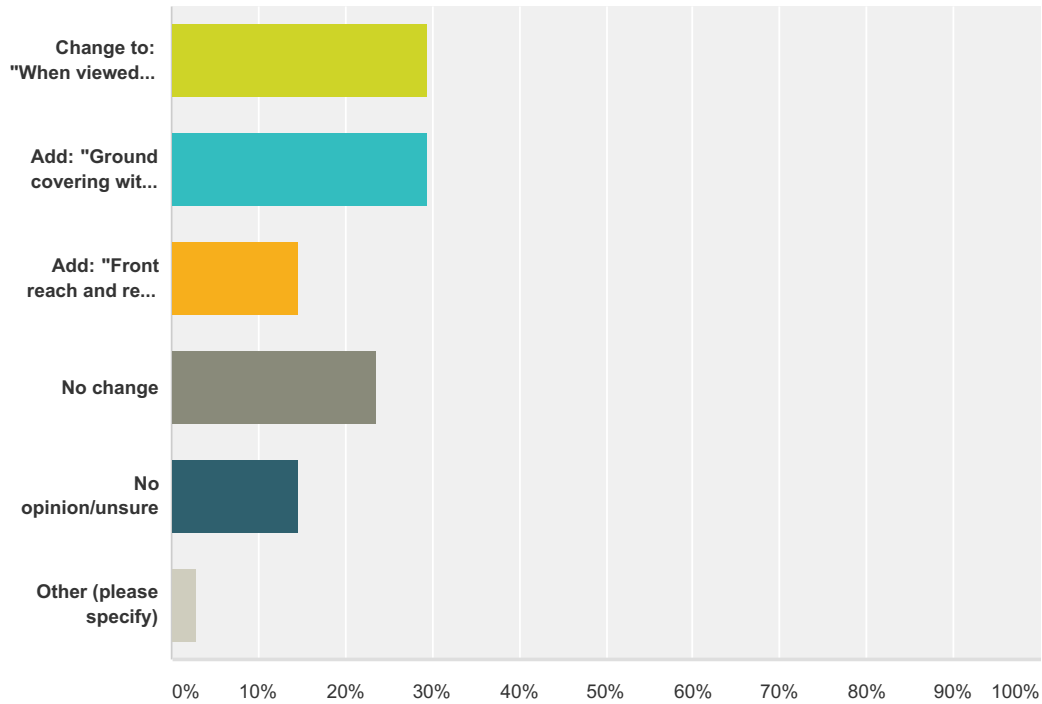

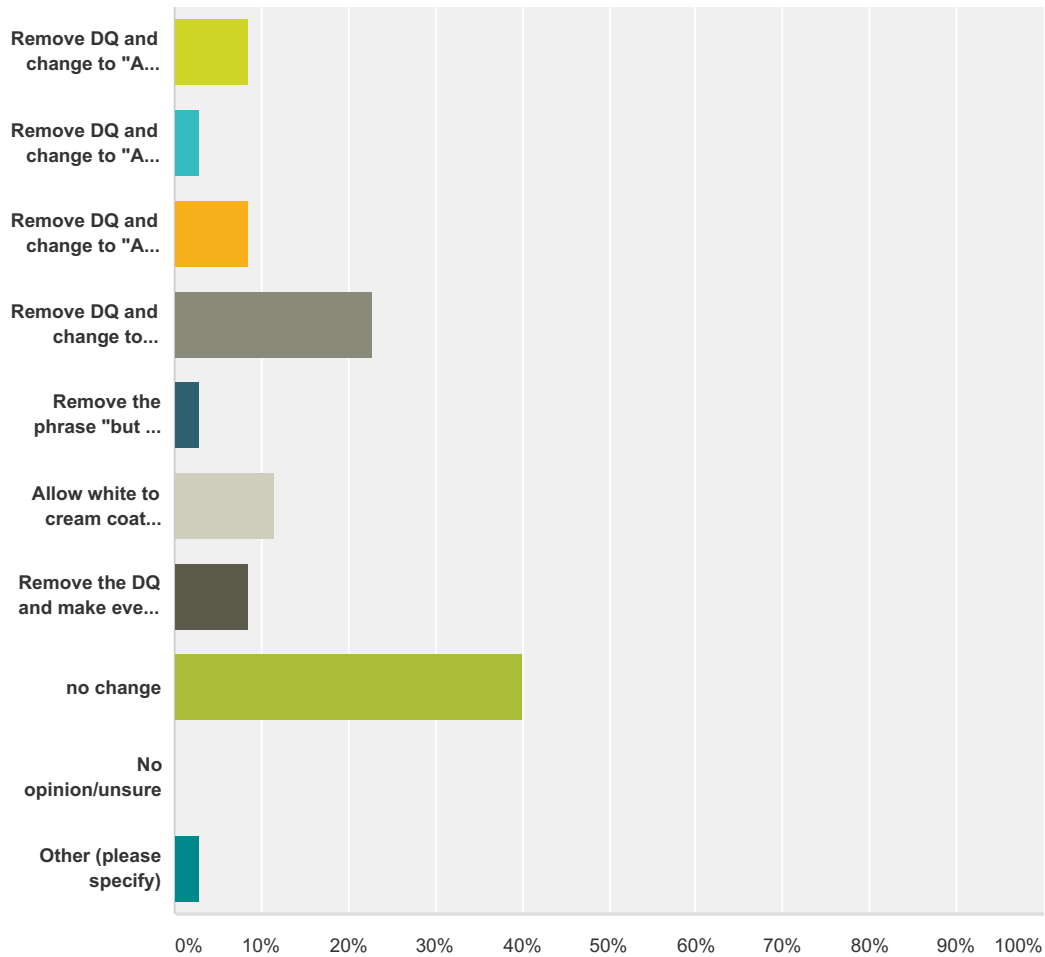
